# • April Security Report

- Nor-Cal is now patrolling 7 days a week. Our biggest issue in the District is transient activity: graffiti, significant property damage. The next largest impact is the amount of residents using our businesses for dumping items such as furniture, tires, windshields, bathtubs, engines, and other items. Nor-Cal and Officer Schouten have been extremely effective in recovering merchandise and preventing theft. Nor-Cal has taken most of the transient calls, so Officer Schouten has more time for shoplifting, organized retail, reports, training security and loss prevention officers.
- o Officer Schouten report: Comparison of January 2022-April 2022 vs Jan 2023-April 2023
  - Burglary/Theft from Vehicle has increased 33% Robbery has increased 75% Shoplifting has decreased 25% Stolen Vehicles has decreased 50% Homeless Camps have decreased 35% Loitering has increased 56% Panhandling has increased 100%

## • April Maintenance Report

- In the month of April, our porter picked up 71 bags of trash, removed 29 pieces of large items, picked up and returned 92 shopping carts and removed 16 graffiti tags.
- We have been focused on clearing Marie Calendars and keeping that area clean. They now have regular lawn maintenance, and we are working with them to keep it boarded up for less break-ins.
- The former China Buffet, which has been another hotspot for transient activity, has a new sushi tenant.
- The City is currently without a homeless Navigator and is looking for a new provider to contract with for navigator services.

- Business Attraction Update
  - SMP received a \$10,000 grant for attracting tenants and retaining existing businesses. We are re-launching "locateinsmp". This will include a page on our website, a business walk this Fall, promoting the city's resources and grants and assistance for owners and brokers.
