WELCOME AND INTRODUCTIONS.....L. Cordell

Lisa Cordell opened the meeting at 10:00 AM with short welcome and introductions.

REPORTS.....L. Cordell

- Citrus Height Police Department (Stats YTD November 2024) -Lieutenant Wes Herman provided statistical information regarding recent events. He reported that three arrests were made at Target as part of an undercover retail theft operation. Furthermore, he noted that investigations are ongoing concerning a robbery that occurred at Canes, with the suspect also linked to a prior robbery at the Canes location in Roseville. Additionally, it was announced that the Retail Theft and Loss Prevention Regional Meeting is scheduled to take place in Citrus Heights on January 9th. Lieutenant Herman also addressed the Flock Wing Gate initiative, which enables businesses to integrate their camera systems with the Live Monitoring System.

**SECURITY TOPICS FOR
DISCUSSION.....K. Carpenter**

- **Chronic Nuisance Offender Program Strategy/602's (Top 10 list)** - Lieutenant Wes Herman has informed us of the transition from the Trespass Notice to a Letter of Agency. Property owners must sign this letter if they wish for law enforcement to act on their behalf in their absence to address individuals found on their property. Lisa will distribute the new form for property owners to sign via email.



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- **Hours of Operations** - Kathilyn provided a brief overview of the need to revise the hours of our overnight patrol in order to facilitate the removal of transients from businesses during the early morning hours. She also indicated that overnight security services will be discontinued following July, as the costs associated with these services were covered by the ARPA Grant. The intention behind hiring security personnel was to deter graffiti activity; however, the overnight security team was unable to apprehend any individuals engaged in this behavior. With only one vehicle assigned to patrol the area, it proved difficult for them to observe graffiti tagging as it was occurring.

MAINTENANCE TOPICS OF

DISCUSSION.....K. Carpenter

- **Hot Spots (Identify hot spots for residential dumping/graffiti)** - Graffiti remains SMP’s most significant issue, and the cleanup of numerous gang graffiti tags in the District were completed last month. During our discussions, we explored various strategies to effectively abate graffiti. Addressing this problem requires a multi-faceted approach to ensure a cleaner and safer environment for our community.
